	At the conference events, photographs are taken of the participants, which are kept by the Data Controller for the purpose of authentic documentation of the history of the conference and for the promotion of the conference, and published on request
THE LEGAL BASIS FOR PROCESSING:	Article 6(1)(e) GDPR: processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the controller.

DURATION OF DATA RETENTION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • - The Data Controller will keep the data related to registration and participation requests until the end of the conference, 7 October 2024. • - Personal data used for naming purposes will be transferred to the Data Subjects at the opening of the conference. • - The email addresses provided upon registration are intended to be kept indefinitely for professional contact purposes, but not longer than the period during which the Data Controller is a member of the UIMC international organisation. • - The retention period for photos taken during the conference is set by the Controller at 30 years. After 30 years, the retention period shall be reviewed, taking into account what data are historically relevant, authentic in terms of timeliness, after 30 years

DATA SECURITY MEASURES	<p>The Data Controller shall inform the data subjects of the possible data processing prior to the event. The Data Controller undertakes to ensure the security of the data, to take technical and organisational measures and to establish rules of procedure to manage the risks arising from the processing, in particular from accidental or unlawful destruction or accidental loss, alteration, unauthorised disclosure of or access to personal data transmitted, stored or otherwise processed. The documents containing the Data Subjects' data are stored in lockable cabinets at the Data Controller's headquarters and on password-protected IT devices. All employees of the Data Controller are bound by confidentiality. The Controller stores electronic data on its own servers.</p> <p>The notice of the processing will be sent to the participants of the event by electronic mail, but will also be provided in printed form on request.</p> <p>If an event participant objects to being filmed, it shall be ensured, as far as possible, that he or she is not included in the footage.</p>
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RIGHTS OF CONFERENCE PARTICIPANTS/ DATA SUBJECTS IN RELATION TO DATA MANAGEMENT	<p>The Data Controller shall respond to written requests received by the Data Controller within a maximum of one month in writing to the contact details provided by the data subject, by post or, if the request is made by e-mail, by e-mail.</p> <p>The date of receipt of the request shall not count towards the time limit.</p>
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Right of access	<p>The data subject may request information in writing from the Controller as to whether or not his or her personal data are being processed and, if so, he or she has the right to know what personal data are being processed by the Controller, on what legal basis, for what purposes, from what source and for how long. Furthermore, to whom, when, under what law, to which personal data has the Controller granted access or to whom has the Controller transferred personal data. The Data Controller shall provide a copy of the personal data it processes free of charge to the data subject upon his or her request for the first time, and may subsequently charge a reasonable fee based on administrative costs.</p> <p>In order to ensure data security and to protect the rights of the data subject, the Data Controller shall verify the identity of the data subject and of the person who wishes to exercise the right of access, and to this end, the provision of information, access to or copying of the data shall be subject to the identification of the data subject.</p>
Right to rectification	<p>The data subject may request a change of data location before the start of the conference, which must be submitted in writing to the Data Controller.</p> <p>In order to ensure data security and to protect the rights of the data subject, the Data Controller shall verify the identity of the data subject and of the person who wishes to exercise his/her right of access, and to this end, the provision of information, access to data and the issue of copies thereof shall be subject to the identification of the data subject.</p>
Right to erasure and right to be forgotten	<p>In relation to the processing described in this notice, the data subject may exercise his or her right to erasure only if the data is no longer necessary for the performance of the organisational tasks of the Data Controller</p>

Right to restriction of processing	<p>The data subject shall have the right to obtain, at his or her request, the restriction of processing by the controller if one of the following conditions is met:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - the data subject contests the accuracy of the personal data, in which case the restriction shall apply for a period of time which allows the controller to verify the accuracy of the personal data; - the processing is unlawful and the data subject opposes the erasure of the data and requests instead the restriction of their use; - the controller no longer needs the personal data for the purposes of the processing but the data subject requires them for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims - the data subject has objected to the processing, in which case the restriction shall apply for a period of time until it is established whether the legitimate grounds of the controller prevail over the legitimate grounds of the data subject. <p>Where processing is subject to restriction, personal data subject to restriction may be processed, except for storage, only with the consent of the data subject or for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims or for the protection of the rights of another natural or legal person or of an important public interest of the Union or of a Member State.</p> <p>The controller shall inform the data subject at whose request the processing has been restricted in advance of the lifting of the restriction.</p>
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Right to object	The data subject may object to the processing if he or she considers that the Controller would not process his or her personal data properly in relation to the purposes specified in this privacy notice. In such a case, the Controller must demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing of the personal data which overriding legitimate interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject or relating to the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims.
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LEGAL REMEDIES:	If any data subject believes that his or her rights concerning the processing of his or her personal data have been infringed or that the Data Controller is not processing his or her personal data in accordance with the applicable data protection requirements, he or she may lodge a complaint with the Data Protection Officer of the Data Controller for information and to exercise his or her rights.
	<p>or further redress, a complaint can be lodged with the National Authority for Data Protection and Freedom of Information. 	The data protection authority where the complaint is lodged must inform the data subject of the outcome of the procedure. The Data Subject shall have the right to a judicial remedy against the outcome. The data subject is free to decide whether to bring an action before the court having jurisdiction over his or her place of residence (permanent address) or domicile (temporary address) or the court having jurisdiction over the seat of the Authority (Metropolitan Court). The detailed rules of the complaint procedure are laid down in the provisions of Act CXII of 2011 on the Right of Informational Self-Determination and Freedom of Information (Infotv.). A data subject who has suffered pecuniary or non-pecuniary damage as a result of a breach of the Regulation may take legal action against the controller for the damage suffered, and is entitled to compensation or damages.

The Data Controller reserves the right to amend the Privacy Notice at any time.
